ALL THE WEEKEND ACTION

Premier

LEATHERHEAD climbed off the foot of the table with a 2-1 victory at Hendon on Sunday, despite going into the game without top scorers Greg Andrews and Tommy Hutchings. Andrews was married on Saturday and Hutchings was suspended.

Hendon were also depleted, including the absence of their leading marksmen Greg Ngoyi and Jamie Busby, but went ahead when Elliott Charles converted a sixth-minute penalty.

Kev Terry replied with a dipping volley in the 27th minute and skipper Mark Simmons put Tanners in front with a deflected shot seven minutes later.

Hendon dominated the second half but rarely troubled Chico Ramos in the visiting goal. They came closest through two of their substitutes as the game went into added time.

James Fisher had a shot cleared off the line by Chris Boulter and, a minute or so later, Belal Aite-Ouakrim shot inches wide. But Leatherhead held out and move up two places, above East Thurrock and new bottom club Horsham.

Struggling Aveley, who parted company with manager Carl Griffiths during the week, came close to an unexpected victory on Saturday.

Ricky Manderson put Millers ahead from long range after 14 minutes, Sean Bonnett-Johnson added another ten minutes after the break and they looked well on their way to three points, surviving under heavy pressure until Sam Long pulled one back with 11 minutes to go.

Mark Willy then struck in the last minute to make it a 2-2 draw, still a disappointing result for Cray who stay seventh in the table when a win would have lifted them to fourth. Aveley, who had experienced manager Lee Patterson in charge as a caretaker, remain 18th.

Leon Smith hit his 11th league goal of the season, the best in the Premier, to set Wingate on their way to a 3-1 home win over Concord in the division's only other Saturday fixture.

Smith and Ahmet Rifat put Wingate 2-0 up in 11 minutes, setting up goals for each other. Tony Stokes replied in the 25th minute but Rifat struck again midway through the second half to clinch victory. Wingate moved to within two points of the play-off places while Concord remain in the relegation zone.

Two Premier clubs without a league fixture played their third-round tie in the Alan Boon Cup, and Hastings gave new player-manager Sean Ray a perfect start with a 2-1 home win over Tooting to reach the last 16.

Kenny Pogue scored in the fifth minute and also hit the winner in the 72nd minute, Andre McCollin having replied for the Terrors late in the first half.



North

TWO more goals for Needham Market's Sam Newson saw off Ryman North's bottom club Ilford at Cricklefield on Saturday.

Newson gave Needham the lead on the stroke of half-time. Clydie Roberts thumped home an equaliser soon after the break in a style that would have delighted his cousin Jermain Defoe, but it was all in vain for the Foxes as Newson struck again in the 68th minute and it finished 2-1 to the visitors.

It was his 15th league goal of the season and restored his clear lead in the Golden Boot race; Bognor's Jason Prior had earlier caught up with him by completing a hat-trick. Newson's tally of 23 in league and cup puts him five ahead of Maidstone's Shaun Welford.

Two of the division's surprise packets met at Tilbury, where nine-man Waltham Forest came from 3-1 down to earn a 3-3 draw.

Josh Bonnett fired Forest into the lead after three minutes and Alex Read squared it after 20. Forest's real problems began in the 35th minute when skipper Gaz Dauti was dismissed for handling a goalbound shot and Sam West converted the penalty. Harry Cook added a third before the interval.

Joel Palmer reduced the arrears shortly after the restart but a red card for Andras Molnar in the 52nd minute seemed to have ended Forest's hopes. They refused to give up, though, and Manu Dagher hit their point-saver five minutes from time. Indeed, they came close to a winner.

Tilbury dropped from third to fifth, overtaken by both Leiston and Enfield Town. Leiston won 2-0 at Chatham with a fifth-minute goal by Danny Heath and one on the hour by Danny Smy.

Enfield had to come from behind to beat 21st-placed Ware, for whom Danny Johnson struck after ten minutes. It was almost half-time when Adam Wallace replied and there were just three minutes left when Liam Hope settled it.

Kieran Ogunkoya, newly signed from Aveley, gave Brentwood a 16th-minute lead at home to Sudbury but they slipped to a 2-1 defeat and dropped out of the play-off spots. Dave Wareham levelled matters in the 42nd minute and James Baker headed the winner 13 minutes into the second half.

Romford took all three points at home to Heybridge Swifts with two unanswered goals. Abs Seymour

put them ahead in the 65th minute and Addian Clifton made sure with a header 12 minutes later.

It was no surprise that Soham's home game against Cheshunt finished 1-1. It was the seventh draw of the season for both sides, more than any other team in the league. Matt Robinson scored for the hosts after 25 minutes and Josh Hutchinson responded with a penalty 12 minutes later. Soham later had Tom Libatore sent off.

South

THE top three in Ryman South continued their impressive form with a hat-trick of victories on Saturday.

Dulwich remain a point clear after extending the league's only 100 per cent home record to seven games, recovering from the shock of an early Williams Adou goal to beat Walton Casuals 3-1.

Adou's fourth-minute goal held up for almost half an hour before Sanchez Ming made it 1-1, and it was the 70th minute before Junior Kadi's penalty put Hamlet ahead. Frankie Sawyer added his 11th league goal.

Shaun Welford took his goal tally to 18 in all competitions with a double in Maidstone's 3-1 win at Eastbourne Town. Michael Phillips gave Stones a sixth-minute lead and, although Sonny Cobbs levelled it on the half-hour, Welford – who had earlier hit the bar – restored the advantage before half-time. Always on top, Stones did not make sure of the win until Welford scored again in added time.

Bognor's Jason Prior, meanwhile, took his total to 17, 14 of them in the league, with a 19-minute hat-trick starting on the half-hour as Rocks swamped visiting Burgess Hill 5-0. James Crane had already given Bognor the lead and Terry Dodd notched the fifth. So Bognor remain a point behind Maidstone who are in turn a point adrift of the leaders, while Hillians drop back into a relegation spot.

Fourth-placed Folkestone were in FA Trophy action and Corinthian-Casuals clung on to the other play-off spot thanks to a double in the last 12 minutes by substitute Steve Barilli which snatched a 2-2 home draw with Whyteleafe. Scott Simpson had given Whyteleafe the lead after 16 minutes and Jerson Dos Santos doubled it 20 minutes after the break.

That kept Casuals a point ahead of Whitehawk, 3-2 winners at Merstham. Joe Gatting put Whitehawk ahead three minutes before half-time but it was all square by the interval and Merstham went ahead three minutes after the restart. Fabio Saravia and Roscoe Dsane were the home marksmen. Hawks would not be denied, however, and Ben Godfrey's 57th-minute strike was followed by Gatting's 70th-minute decider.

New Whitstable boss Justin Luchford must be well pleased with his charges after they thumped Croydon Athletic 4-1 in Kent with caretaker boss Dave Fairclough at the helm. James Simmons set the ball rolling on 16 minutes and Danny Williams

made it 2-0 just before the break. Stuart Vahid stretched the lead with a 52nd-minute penalty and, although Peter Afolayan conjured a swift reply, there was no way back for the Rams and Williams nabbed his second to make sure.

Walton & Hersham went into their home game against Crawley Down with just seven goals to their credit, the league's lowest total, and improved that figure substantially by beating the bottom club 4-1. Now the only team in the league with a single-figure goal tally are East Thurrock, who next Saturday face Macclesfield in the first round of the FA Cup!

Walton were two up at half-time through Daniel Morris and Matt Pattison, and it was 4-0 by the sixth minute of the second period as Pattison and Graeme Purdy hit the target. Luke Blewden managed some consolation for the Anvils, who had Josh Webb sent off.

Sittingbourne drew 2-2 with Chipstead at Central Park, something of a goal feast for the Brickies who had scored only nine goals and conceded 11 in their 11 previous league outings. Hicham Akhazzan put the hosts in front midway through the first half but Marcus Elliott soon replied, netting the rebound when Jason Goodchild's penalty was saved. Goodchild had another chance from the spot in the 66th minute and made no mistake, but Bryan Glover rescued the hosts with a free-kick seven minutes from time.



FA Trophy

REMARKABLE Redbridge were the stars of the show yet again as the Ryman League enjoyed a highly-successful Saturday in the second qualifying round of the FA Trophy, winning seven of their ten match-ups with Southern League opponents.

The Motormen followed up last week's FA Cup victory over Conference Premier side Ebbsfleet by travelling to Southern League leaders Cambridge City and coming out on top by the odd goal in three after being reduced to ten men; surely a good omen for next week when they take on the other half of Oxbridge, Oxford City, in the Cup.

Jamie Haywood put Redbridge ahead five minutes after half-time. City were quickly on level terms but the Motormen would not be denied, despite losing Ben Bradbury to a second yellow card with 20 minutes left, and Joe Gardner hit an 81st-minute winner.

That's another £3,000 in the Oaks bank and a total of £36,200 from their exploits – played eight, won eight – in the two FA competitions. Yet they lie 18th in Ryman North, having taken maximum points from only four of their 11 league games.

Another Ryman North club, Thamesmead, ejected Southern Premier opposition by beating visiting Arlesey 3-0. Danny Penny opened the scoring moments before half-time and he headed another in the 66th minute after Brad Killick had doubled the lead, also with his head.

Two all-Premier games went the way of the Ryman clubs. Lowestoft fell behind to a goal from the prolific John Frendo at Hitchin but ex-Hitchin striker Matt Nolan replied in the 19th minute and the Trawlerboys eventually took the lead with a long-range blockbuster from Scott Mitchell in the 76th minute. Joe Francis made the final score 3-1 with a penalty.

The score was the same at Carshalton, where Cirencester went out despite the boost of a first-minute goal. Dean Lodge quickly replied with a penalty, Laurent Hamici put Robins ahead eight minutes into the second half and Paul Vines finished it off.

Lee Townrow headed the late decider as Maldon edged out visiting Bedfont 3-2. The Ryman side took the lead early in each half, Sos Yao and Leon Antoine the scorers, only to be pegged back.

First-half goals from Rob Swaine and Dave Knight ensured that Ryman Premier leaders Billericay averted an upset as they beat St Neots 2-0 at New Lodge, but they will be disappointed to have had Junior Luke sent off eight minutes from time. The visitors had been reduced to ten earlier in the half.

The last of the seven inter-league victories came from Folkestone, who beat Daventry 4-2 in Kent. Reports of games on November 5 are almost obliged to include a reference to the date and, having held out until this point, it can be avoided no longer. The fireworks at Folkestone came from James Everitt, who scored all four goals.

His first, after 14 minutes, might have been a damp squib as the visitors were soon on level terms. But he restored the lead on 43 minutes to ward off a half-time rocket from the management and his sparkler of a game continued with a hat-trick goal 13 minutes after the restart. Daventry pulled another one back but Everitt and his teammates were turning catherine wheels of delight when he clinched it from the penalty spot in added time.

Godalming fell foul of a legend at Gosport. Steve Claridge made his Football League debut almost two years before Alex Ferguson became Manchester United's manager, yet he has recently donned his boots again to play for the Southern League side and his eighth-minute strike set G's on their way to a 4-0 defeat.

Anton Agdomar gave Potters Bar a fifth-minute lead at Uxbridge but it lasted only two minutes and the Ryman North side were eventually beaten 5-2. Denis Paratusic's dismissal on the half-hour was the key moment, especially as Uxbridge went 3-1 up from the resulting free-kick.

Even so, Mark O'Toole pulled it back to 3-2 in the 58th minute, pouncing when Tom Pett's shot hit a post, and the final scoreline flattered the hosts.

The third Southern League side to come out on top were Didcot, who scored an unanswered goal in each half at Worthing. Rebels played with ten men

for virtually the whole second half after top scorer Ryan McBride was sent off.

There were five all-Ryman ties and the stars of the show were mid-table North division side Harlow, who came from 2-0 down to beat visitors Lewes, third in the Premier, 3-2. Ian Draycott gave Rooks a 1-0 half-time lead and scored again a minute after the break.

Harlow, though, had been on top for much of the time and they were rewarded with a pair of penalties in the 49th and 67th minutes, both converted by Danny Brown. Then James Bunn hit the winner with ten minutes left.

The Essex derby between Grays and Canvey produced four penalties, all successful, as Canvey won 3-2. The first was converted by Harry Agombar, after a foul on Joao Carlos, to give the Ryman North hosts the lead after 25 minutes. Danny Heale replied for Canvey ten minutes later with the only goal from open play. Carlos was again the victim when Agombar was spot-on for the second time after 54 minutes.

Then it was over to Canvey's penalty ace Rob King, who levelled the scores in the 67th minute, after Rob Hill was fouled, and made no mistake again when a handling offence gave him the chance to win it with two minutes left.

FA Cup survivors East Thurrock had to fight for their 4-2 victory at Faversham, for whom Justin Ascheri headed the opener after 12 minutes. Kris Newby and Petrit Elbi scored three minutes either side of half-time to put the Premier side ahead, only for Adrian Stone to make it 2-2 in the 55th minute. Newby converted a penalty on 75 minutes and Colchester loanee Freddy Ladapo, who started the season at Maldon, added a late fourth. There was still time for Faversham to win a penalty of their own, and Tom Stephen was dismissed for the offence, but Lee Shearer shot over the bar.

Bury, too, were given a good run for their money by opposition from a lower division. Hythe made the long trip into Suffolk and fell behind to a long-range Danny Cunningham free-kick on 14 minutes.

Craig Thompson equalised in the 34th minute but Sam Reed quickly restored Bury's lead and added another soon after the interval. Hythe fought back again and Thompson claimed his second with 25 minutes left, but they could do no more.

There were only two all-Ryman Premier ties and both finished 1-1, with replays to come on Tuesday.

Hornchurch went in front when Elliot Styles scored from a 12th-minute corner at Harrow, who replied with a Quincy Rowe header at the same stage of the second half. Gary Jones almost won it for Harrow, but his effort came back off the bar.

Richard Avery put Margate ahead on the stroke of half-time but they will have to travel for a replay at Wealdstone after Rob Fitzgerald squared it in the 57th minute.

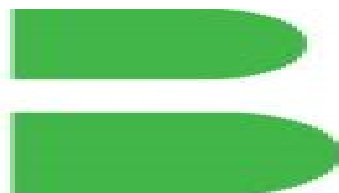

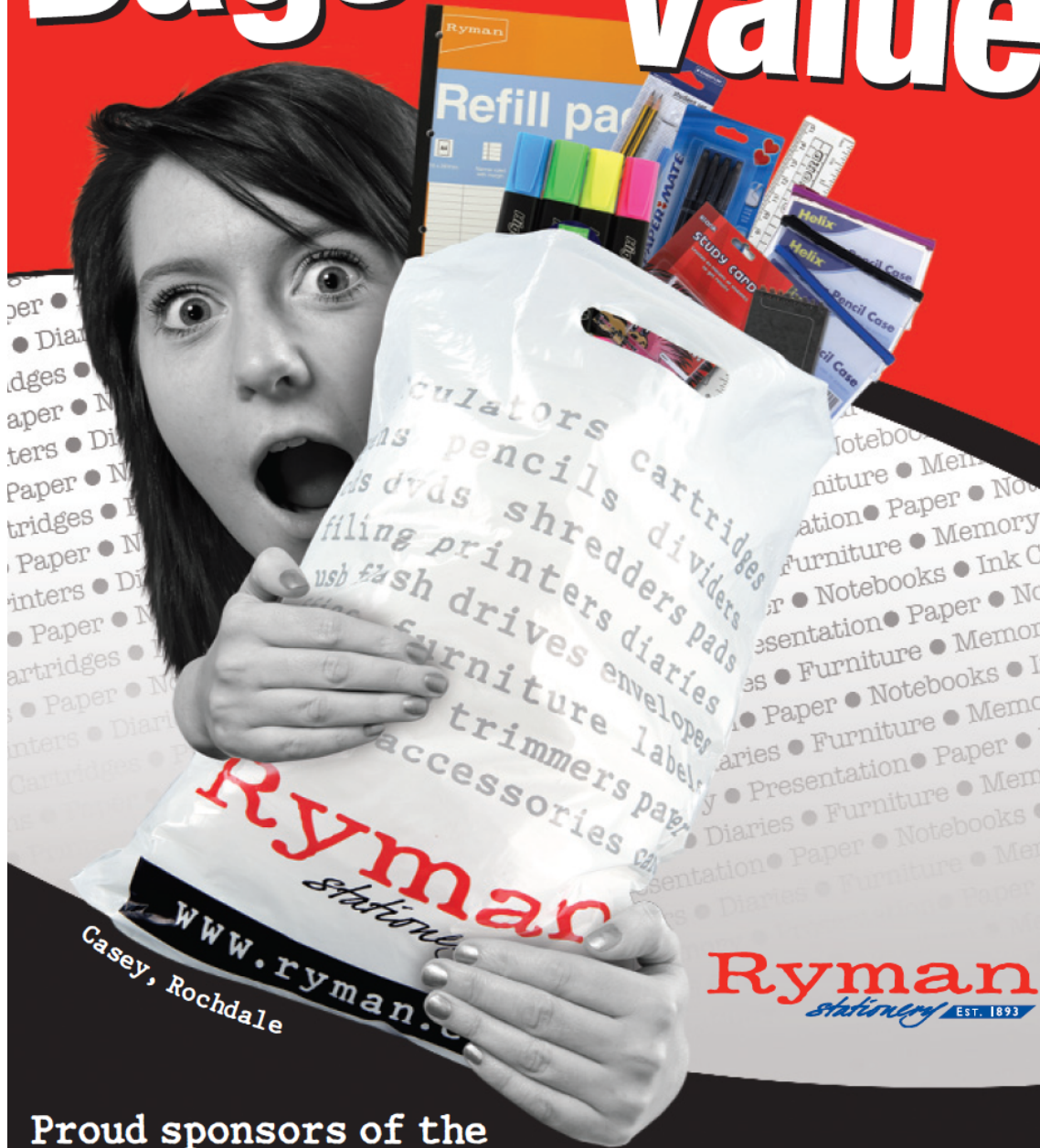
